Nags Head Commits to Attacking Flooding





 - Parks








SHIFTING SANDS – TOWN OF NAGS HEAD SESWA APRIL 2024


STORMWATER EXPENDITURES



- Additional \$1.4MM added in 2023
- Capital Improvement Projects



Item	Action Item	Goal
Septic System Inspection	Increase septic system inspections	Increase septic systems inspections from 150 to 500 incrementally over a 5-year period
Septic Tank Pump Out Rebate	Increase pump out rebate/water bill credit amount from \$45 to \$150 (approx. ½ cost of pump out)	Increase rebate credits from 30 to 250 incrementally over a 5-year period
Septic Loan	Increase max. loan amount from \$7,500 to \$12,000	Provide 5 septic system repair/replacement loans annually
Water Quality and Bacteria Testing	Increase frequency for both water quality and bacteria sampling Sample only for NOs' and Enterococci. No longer sample for phosphorus and other bacteria Add six (6) water quality sampling locations	Conduct Nitrate Nitrogen (NO ₃ *) and Enterococci samples weekly
Groundwater Remote Data Loggers	Continuously log groundwater levels at key locations Add ten (10) groundwater wells Purchase ten (10) remote groundwater data loggers	Install 10 new wells with remote groundwater monitoring stations




