








Population Served by State




Use of Impervious Area as the basis is still trending upward

The highest percentages are SC (92%) and KY (86%)




Fees Do Not Vary by Location within a Community





 - 8% Other






Method of Sending the Bill







Billing Method by State








Credits for Private Detention Facilities

- Local Code Requires Private Detention/Retention
 Facilities 102 (90%) of the Respondents Said Yes
- Credits Provided for Private Detention/Retention
 Facilities 66 (61%) of the Respondents Said Yes

Stormwater Utility Revenue




Average Per Capita Revenue in 2007 was \$32.50

2019 Per Capita Revenue








Capital Construction Costs






Projected Future Capital Needs
